CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

This show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association as set out in the current AAA Showing Rules Manual. The competition shall be subject to the bylaws, rules, regulations and conditions as set down in the Showing Rules Manual of the Australian Alpaca Association and all decisions on the matter in connection with or arising out of the competition shall be binding on the exhibitor.

The Chief Steward has the ultimate power to classify all entries for colour and to inspect each exhibit for disqualifying faults. The Chief Steward or Inspection Steward may consult with the judge, should he/she deem it appropriate for an exhibit to be transferred to another class. Colour classes may be split or merged at the discretion of the Convenor, based on numbers of entries. All exhibitors affected by such class changes will be advised prior to the show.

All exhibitors should read the conditions 1-4 on the entry form and ensure that they can comply with these conditions before signing the entry form, particularly noting the condition dealing with animal health.

1 Health Declaration

A separate health declaration must be signed and returned with the entry form. Failure to sign the entry form will render all alpacas of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited. Please note that the registered owner of an exhibit or his /her authorised agent may sign an entry form. By signing the entry form and Health Declaration Form, all exhibitors declare that to the best of their knowledge, no alpaca exhibited by them should show signs or symptoms of disease at the time of exhibition.

JOHNES DISEASE: Queensland is a BJD Protected Zone. Alpacas cannot enter Queensland unless they are from a BJD Protected Zone, BJD Free Zone, Q-Alpaca or AlpacaMap MN certified. The exhibitor, by signing the health declaration form, declares that the alpacas entered are from a herd or a property which has had no Johnes Disease and have not been in contact with infected animals or properties. Exhibitors whose entries are from a Monitored Negative (MN) or Tested Negative (TN) status herd under MAP program should include their MAP assessment number.

Exhibitors are responsible for compliance with any Government regulatory requirements for the movement of stock interstate and within Queensland. Interstate exhibitors are advised to check for updates to border crossing regulations and opening times.

Alpacas travelling interstate must comply with that State's Department of Primary Industry requirements, and must meet the Queensland Department of Primary Industries requirement regarding travel permits and waybills, particularly noting the JD status of the alpacas being transported. Alpacas travelling from interstate are required to stop at the border crossing for inspection of paperwork. On leaving Queensland, the alpacas will be required to be sprayed at the border crossing.

2 Period of Exhibition

Alpacas must be penned by 8.30am on the day of competition being either Saturday 1st July 2017 or Sunday 2nd July and CANNOT BE REMOVED from the Showgrounds until after gates close. Access to the grounds for penning is also possible after 5pm when gates close to the public and up until 8pm. All exhibitors must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Show Stewards and must not be moved or removed except by order of the Chief Steward. Entrants that disregard this rule will not be permitted entries at future Farm Fantastic Alpacas On Shows.

3 Preparation of Exhibits and Cleanliness of Stalls

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean, and give proper attention to their stock throughout the Show. Exhibitors must provide their own feed and containers for feed / water.

4 Advertising

Promotional material is permitted within the bounds of the standard pen height for that show. Ribbons won at any other previous show are not permitted. A handler shall be deemed to be incorrectly attired if his/her dress or the animal being led displays any information capable of being construed as advertising for any stud.

5 Companion animals and dogs

Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the Convenor or Chief Steward prior to submission of the entry form, otherwise no companion alpacas will be permitted. No dogs are permitted into the precinct of where Show animals are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide Dogs are exempt.

6 Inspection of Exhibits

All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpaca's IAR number. **A copy of the pedigree certificate of each alpaca entered is not required.**

No animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire (except for wethers). All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction. No wether may have any visible genetic faults or physical disfigurement.

The Convenor shall appoint a person, or persons, as a qualified inspector, or inspectors, who shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number and visible physical disfigurement.

Any animal which, in the opinion of the Chief Steward and/or veterinary surgeon, is not in a fit state to be exhibited may be rejected by them and debarred from competing in the class or classes for which it has been entered. Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward.

The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for age, sex and colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

The inspection of all alpacas will commence after 5pm on Friday 30th or Saturday 1st July 5pm. Alternatively at 7.00am on Saturday 1st or Sunday 2nd. Alpacas not in their allocated pens to be available for inspection at the official time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Exhibitors must be in attendance at the time of the inspection and will be required to assist.

Exhibits of Huacayas must carry a minimum fleece length of 50mm and a recommended maximum length not exceeding 130mm. Huacaya alpacas 12 months and older must be shorn annually so that no more than 15 months fleece is carried at the time of showing. The minimum fleece length for Suris is 75mm and fleece length will be assessed by the Judge. Suri alpacas must have no more than 24 months fleece growth at the time of showing.

Any alpaca found to have lice or mite infestation must be removed from the showgrounds immediately along with any other alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.

NOTE: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an animal exhibit, official AAA confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Replacement tag orders and payments must be lodged with the National Office a minimum of one week before the date of the show.

Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the animal.

7 Exhibitors' Meeting - Chief Steward

The Chief Steward requests that all exhibitors attend a meeting at 9.30am on competition days to be briefed on Show procedures for the day.

8 Correct Animal Colour Classification

An alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour. Any colour variations will be assessed at time of inspection. The chief steward may move animals into a different colour class upon inspection of exhibit. Exhibits shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece. Guides to colour classifications:

- **White:** constitutes a pristine, bright white fleece. [NB: white animals with light fawn on the neck or backline should be entered in the light fawn class].
- **Light fawn:** alpacas with a cream or off white fleece or that have light fawn on the neck or backline.
- **Grey:** a predominantly grey alpaca is to be shown in a grey class, whether or not it has any other coloured spots present and any colour variations will be assessed at the Judge's discretion. The grey classes will include light greys, medium greys, dark greys and rose greys.
- **Roan:** an alpaca that is fawn, brown or black with white fibres through the blanket of the fleece. A roan usually appears externally to be a solid fawn, brown or black, until the fleece is opened, at which time the white fibres are visible and uniformly interspersed throughout the blanket of the fleece.
- **Fancy:** an alpaca is to be shown in a fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of colour e.g. two or more different coloured saddle markings. [NB: An alpaca with a solid saddle of one colour and different colour markings on the head, chest or legs does not constitute a fancy alpaca].

9 Age of Alpaca

Alpacas must be entered into the correct class for their age. Age of animals is calculated from the birth date shown on the registration certificate up to Show date, i.e. 1st or 2nd July.

10 Wethers

It is a requirement for wethers to be registered on the IAR to compete at shows run under AAA Ltd. rules.

11 Best of Colour

Best of Colour Classes will be run at the Caboolture Farm Fantastic Alpacas On Show.

12 Sire's Progeny Class

Sire's Progeny Class - comprises a group of two alpacas (males or females but not wethers) six months and over, not necessarily owned or bred by one exhibitor, all progeny of one sire drawn from ordinary classes (ie must have been entered as exhibits in the other classes of this show). Only one progeny from any one dam may be shown in each sire's progeny group.

Entries may be lodged before 12noon on the day of the show. Only one entry fee is required per progeny group. Progeny group must display their progeny exhibit number PLUS their INITIAL exhibitor number which shows their age and age of fleece.

There must be at least 2 entries (2 alpacas per entry) in the sire's progeny class for the judging to go ahead.

13 Ribbons

Ribbons will be awarded to placings in their Classes, and sashes to all Champions /Supreme Champions/Best In Show. RIBBON COLOURS: Blue 1st, Red 2nd, White 3rd. Winners of the Fancy Classes and Wether Classes are not included in championships and cannot qualify for Best In Show.

14 Protests

Only an exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The protest shall be lodged in writing together with a deposit of \$50, which shall be refunded if the protest is upheld. The sole grounds for a protest shall be a breach of the Show Rules.

Protests shall be lodged with the Chief Steward or Show Convenor within one hour of alleged incident occurring. Complaints against Judges are to be put in writing, within one week of the alleged incident, addressed to the AAA Ltd. National Secretary, c/- AAA Ltd. National Office accompanied by a \$50 fee, which will be refunded in the event that the complaint is upheld.

15 Gate Fees

The Caboolture Farm Fantastic Expo reserves the right to charge all exhibitors an entry fee to enter the show grounds.

16 Halter Entries

A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas or proposed exhibits prior to, or during the Show judging. The Judge's decision shall be final. He/she may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class. In the event of the Judge deciding that exhibits in any Class or Championship are not worthy of the prize, no prize or ribbon shall be awarded.

17 Handlers Attire

All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or parade shall wear a white coat over long trousers or long skirts, with clean dress shoes or boots. The only logo allowed on the coat is the new AAA Ltd logo, or a plain white coat. No advertising or stud names may be visible on the handler's attire whilst in the show ring. The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire. All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit, or removal from the ring may be requested by the Judge. It is recommended that children not exhibit large animals that they cannot control.

Each exhibitor will be allocated a Catalogue Number as published in the CATALOG. All exhibitors will be supplied with clip-on exhibit numbers cards with a catalogue number corresponding with their entries. All exhibitors should ensure exhibit numbers are clearly displayed on the handler's white coat while in the judging ring. The age of the animal and age of the animal's fleece is to be printed on the corners of the exhibit number for easy reference by the judge.

18 Fleeces Entries

All fleeces being exhibited (including wether fleeces) must be from alpacas registered on the IAR and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. All exhibitors must be AAA Ltd. financial members. Fleeces are to be lodged with the Fleece Steward by post or in person by arrangement by 5pm on 20th June.

Only one fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one animal. It is recommended that fleeces be placed in bags, made of satin or similar material, or heavy duty plastic. Plastic garbage bags should be avoided.

Exhibitors, when submitting fleeces at the Show, must attach to the fleece the identification slip supplied (no names).

19 Alpaca Youth Paraders Entries - Classes Open / Preliminary will only be run at this event

The Alpaca Youth Paraders Competition (YPC) is a new event in the showcase of alpaca activities, designed specifically and exclusively for young people aged under 26 years of age. Generally the guidelines for the competition is as outlined in the current version of the Australian Alpaca Association Youth Paraders Handbook. Specifically, for Farm Fantastic Alpacas On Show, the following rules will apply.

At Farm Fantastic Alpacas On Show, the Alpaca Youth Paraders competition will consist of two sections:

- Showmanship and
- Stockmanship

In each section, Paraders may choose to enter in one of the following divisions of competency:

- Preliminary
- Open

There are four age groups for each section in both Preliminary and Open divisions. All ages refer to the age of the exhibitor on the date of the event / show. The four age groups are defined as:

- Junior – aged 7 years to under 11 years
- Intermediate – aged 11 years to under 15 years
- Senior – aged 15 years to under 18 years
- Adult – aged 18 years to under 26 years.

Exhibitors may enter in either or both sections, however, to be eligible for the Champion of age group or overall Grand Champion or the Master Trainer award, the exhibitor must have entered into both Showmanship and Stockmanship classes.

To be eligible for the Master Trainer award the exhibitor must have been the sole trainer of the alpaca entered.

Showmanship Classes

- The showmanship section is designed to demonstrate the handler's level of proficiency in the preparation, presentation, handling and understanding of their alpaca.
- This section is performed with the alpaca at halter and contains two parts: Show Ringcraft and Proficiencies. All competitors are reminded that penalty points will be taken off at the Judge's discretion for alpaca conformation considered as seriously below the breed standard, or presentation seriously short of show standard.

Stockmanship Classes

- The Stockmanship section aims to demonstrate the skill of the handler in developing a sound working relationship with the alpaca over a series of challenges, known as stations, over a set course which aims to simulate conditions frequently encountered in the daily management of alpacas, either on a farm or in some public forum. Ideally, the handler will be able to demonstrate the existence of a relationship of trust and cooperation between him or herself and the alpaca.
- Together the alpaca and handler will be asked to complete a course, comprising a series of stations. Stations may constitute an exercise or a challenge.
- Preliminary Division will consist of 10 Stations of moderate difficulty.
- Open Division will consist of a minimum of 10 Stations, of which at least four will be set at the highest degree of difficulty.
- The course does not change across age groups, the degree of difficulty increases for each division. The final course and placement, degree of difficulty, and the order of stations is the responsibility of the Judge.

Attire

- Minimum standard of safe clothing compulsory for

all Paraders events e.g. closed shoes, long trousers, minimal /no loose jewellery and hair tidy/up.

- Showmanship Section: Black Trousers, Collared shirt with properly fitted show coat or full school uniform. In the case of Juniors, a neat white shirt instead of a show coat is acceptable.
- Stockmanship Section: Neat rural/country smart dress codes will draw maximum points including: hat, boots, belt, jeans/moleskins, collared long sleeve shirt.

Reporting Times

- Participants must report to the Chief Steward's desk no less than 20 minutes prior to the competition. The event may be re-scheduled at the discretion of the Convener.

Animals used for Youth Paraders Competition

- Must be entered in the Halter Classes to be eligible to be used in these events, entire and wether quality animals will be accepted.
- Alpacas may be shared by prearrangement in Preliminary and Open Divisions, but an alpaca may be used no more than twice in any one class in their age group. However, there needs to be a minimum of four entries in any one class for an alpaca to be used twice. [s2.1(c) Youth Paraders Handbook]

The Australian Alpaca Association Youth Paraders Handbook provides the guidelines for this competition. All participants / mentor breeders need to contact Helen Phillips on 4921 0531 to organise a copy of the guidelines to be emailed to them.

20 Junior Judges Entries

This competition to encourage and develop interest and involvement in alpacas by young people between 15 and 25 years of age will be conducted under AAA Ltd show conditions and evaluation carried out by an AAA Ltd accredited Judge (the Overjudge).

Place ribbons and prizes will be awarded. A minimum of two (2) entries must be received for competition to proceed.

The total possible score is 150 points, made up of 50 points for correct placement of the four animals; assessment taken from the Hormal Scale) 50 points for the visual and 50 points for oral presentation.

Visual Section:

- Competitors are allowed five minutes to judge the four animals and to complete their placing card.
- The number of competitors required to present oral judgments is left to the discretion of the Judge/Chief Steward. Where the number of competitors is large,

it may be appropriate to select the top eight visual class scorers.

- Competitors are scored on handling, general competence, ringcraft, presentation and dress.

Oral Section:

- Competitors are allowed three minutes to inform the Over Judge of the reasons for their placings.
- Competitors are scored on accuracy of observation, ability to compare animals and speaking ability.

Entrants will be expected to be familiar with the current AAA Ltd Showing Rules Manual with particular attention to Alpaca Breed Standards – Huacaya and Suri Conformation, Huacaya Fleece and Suri Fleece.

- The competition will be conducted as follows:
One group of four animals will be judged by the entrants.
- There will be one visual class and one oral class.
- Each competitor's performance will be observed by an Over Judge who will allocate marks.
- The judging criteria to be used is that set out by the AAA.
- The age of competitors is to be between 15-25 years.
- Entrants are strongly advised to attend an Alpaca Junior Judging Workshop prior to the Junior Judging Competition.

Reporting Times

Participants must report to the Chief Steward's desk no less than 20 minutes prior to the competition. The event may be re-scheduled at the discretion of the Convener.

Attire

Smart, neat casual dress as follows:
trousers/slacks; clean shoes or boots, shirt.

21 Exhibitors' Code of Conduct

- Participants shall not engage in the following activities or behaviours while attending AAA Ltd. Endorsed shows:
 - Negative, obstructive or disruptive behaviour.
 - Abusive or foul language, rude gestures in public.
 - Cruelty and mistreatment of alpacas.
 - Lack of compliance with AAA Ltd. Showing Rules including attempts to circumvent rules or procedures.
 - Falsification of information required by the show including but not limited to: entry information, disclosure statements, shearing dates, dates of birth, registration certificates or ownership of alpacas.
- Participants shall be courteous and gracious to judges, officials and fellow exhibitors at all times, regardless of class placements.
- Shows are public events; therefore, all show participants should at all times conduct themselves in a positive, professional and courteous manner. For those entering the ring clothing should be neat and professional and be consistent with the dress code for the individual show.
- Show participants are assumed to know all AAA Ltd. showing rules. Such individuals who voluntarily elect to participate in AAA Ltd. endorsed shows do so with the understanding that they are bound by these rules and are liable to incur disciplinary action for infringement of them.
- Breaches in any of the above may result in a protest or report being filed by the Chief Steward or other show officials with the AAA Ltd. for consideration of disciplinary action.
